 - A: Green & Blacks Maya Gold chocolate, Clipper tea, Cafédirect Coffee (2 points)

FAIRTRADE FACTS

A: Fairtrade premium. (Extra money paid on top of the Fairtrade minimum price, democratically invested by the farmers in community development, environmental and business improvements) (1 point)

25. Name three Fairtrade sports balls that you can buy

A: Footballs, volley balls, rugby balls, netballs (2 points)

26. Kopi Luwak, the world's most expensive coffee (up to \$600 per pound) is:

A. Grown in the highest altitude region of Madagascar
