

Ways to support #1: Share content


Share content

Ways to support #2: Run an event or local initiative

Run an event: Any event you can run that helps get those key messages out there will be a real boost. A few ideas campaigners have already shared

Highcrest Academy school: a talk & presentation by the Ambassador of Costa Rica and the unveiling of a plaque celebrating the Fairtrade Towns Partnership between Grecia, Costa Rica and High Wycombe.

Also plan to have a CoopeVictoria single origin celebration coffee produced by a local micro-roaster for the occasion and to be marketed locally.

Edinburgh :I will be involved in Edinburgh Fairtrade City events

Chorley: I will be giving an update on the Chocolate Has A Name project as the children do their first chocolate making workshops

University of Manchester: Wednesday 1 March all day event at The University of Manchester

Dewsbury: Our Eco Council are having a fairtrade stall at our International Womens Day event.

East Grinstead: Fairtrade Quiz and Meal organised by Fairtrade EG plus information stall and display at EG Library.
